Animal Distress Triage & GPS Reporting Protocol

Step-by-step reporting guide for community feeders and citizens reporting injuries to the 24/7 SOS helpline.

CORE SCENE SAFETY & RESPONSE DIRECTIVES

- **Step 1: Assess Environmental Safety:** Never rush into high-speed traffic lanes. Position safety cones, reflective jackets, or vehicle hazard lights before attending to any animal.
- **Step 2: Maintain Non-Threatening Demeanor:** Speak in a calm tone. Avoid direct prolonged eye contact with traumatized dogs or large cattle.
- **Step 3: Document GPS & Condition:** Capture a 15-second clear video highlighting landmarks, visible wounds, or limb mobility.
- **Step 4: Dispatch Escalation:** Immediately call +91 75310 99000 to coordinate Mobile ICU Ambulance arrival or gaushala transport.

SPECIES-SPECIFIC PROTOCOL HIGHLIGHTS

- **Canine Incidents:** Use slip leads and soft muzzle wraps if biting risk is present due to severe trauma. Never attempt physical restraint of a suspected rabid animal.
- **Cattle & Large Animals:** Approach from shoulder/front angle; stay clear of rear kicking arc. Keep crowd at least 20 feet away to prevent panic bolting.
- **Birds (Avian Distress):** Use a clean dark towel to cover the bird. Gently place in a perforated cardboard box with dry paper towel lining. Never force water drops into nostrils or throat.
